What is the Intermediate Track?

This guide shows what is taught in the intermediate stages of the program. The Intermediate Track helps students move from an elementary level to a confident, independent speaker who can handle complex real-world conversations and professional settings.

This matches the international CEFR B1 and B2 standards.

Simple Monthly Billing: Even though the program is split into 3-month steps to help students learn smoothly, classes are billed month by month. There are no contracts or long-term commitments.

What Students Will Learn

Level 1: Intermediate English Part 1 (CEFR B1)

Duration: 3 Months • Billed Monthly • Goal: Handle Familiar Topics & Personal Experiences

- **Everyday Interactions:** Understand the main points of clear standard input on familiar matters regularly encountered in work, school, and leisure.
- **Narrating Events:** Connect sentences to describe experiences, events, dreams, hopes, and ambitions in a structured manner.
- **Opinions & Plans:** Briefly give reasons and explanations for opinions, future plans, and upcoming projects.
- **Travel Situations:** Deal with most situations likely to arise while travelling in an area where the language is spoken.

Level 2: Intermediate English Part 2 (CEFR B1)

Duration: 3 Months • Billed Monthly • Goal: Expand Vocabulary and Social Expression

- **Detailed Descriptions:** Provide detailed accounts of personal experiences, feelings, and reactions to books, films, or news events.
- **Workplace Basics:** Participate in simple workplace discussions, take standard messages, and write brief emails or formal reports on familiar topics.
- **Sustaining Conversations:** Maintain a conversation or discussion on a wide range of familiar topics with increased fluency.
- **Grammar & Structure:** Master the usage of perfect tenses, passive voice, and conditional sentences for hypothetical scenarios.

Level 3: Intermediate English Part 3 (CEFR B1)

Duration: 3 Months • Billed Monthly • Goal: Achieve Solid Independence and Confidence

- **Complex Discussions:** Follow abstract or technical discussions within one's own field of expertise or personal interest.
- **Writing with Clarity:** Write straightforward connected texts on a variety of subjects, summarizing and evaluating information from multiple sources.
- **Spontaneous Response:** Express emotions and respond spontaneously to unexpected turns in daily conversations.
- **Media Comprehension:** Understand the main ideas of complex radio broadcasts, podcasts, and video materials on both concrete and abstract topics.

Level 4: Upper Intermediate English Part 1 (CEFR B2)

Duration: 3 Months • Billed Monthly • Goal: Move Toward High Fluency & Textual Analysis

- **Advanced Textual Understanding:** Understand the main ideas of complex text on both concrete and abstract topics, including technical discussions in their field of specialization.
- **Natural Interaction:** Interact with a degree of fluency and spontaneity that makes regular interaction with native speakers quite possible without strain for either party.
- **Clear and Detailed Text:** Produce clear, detailed text on a wide range of subjects and explain a viewpoint on a topical issue giving the advantages and disadvantages of various options.
- **Professional Idioms:** Master common phrasal verbs, idioms, and professional expressions to sound more natural and precise.

Level 5: Upper Intermediate English Part 2 (CEFR B2)

Duration: 3 Months • Billed Monthly • Goal: Speak Fluidly and Formulate Strong Arguments

- **Active Debating:** Take an active part in discussions in familiar contexts, accounting for and sustaining your views with clear arguments.
- **Nuanced Comprehension:** Identify finer emotional tones, sarcasm, and implied meaning in native-level audio, movies, and podcasts.
- **Professional Communication:** Draft comprehensive professional documents, including resume summaries, formal emails, and structured meeting outlines.
- **Grammar Precision:** Minimize systematic errors and master advanced sentence inversion, relative clauses, and subtle modal nuances.

Level 6: Upper Intermediate English Part 3 (CEFR B2)

Duration: 3 Months • Billed Monthly • Goal: Achieve Total Autonomy & Professional Readiness

- **Spontaneous Professional Fluency:** Communicate with native speakers fluently and flexibly in social, academic, and professional environments.
- **Presentations & Speeches:** Deliver clear, systematically developed presentations, highlighting significant points and providing relevant supporting details.
- **Critical Reading & Evaluation:** Read contemporary literary prose and articles with high independence, identifying underlying perspectives.
- **Course Wrap-up & Mastery:** Successfully synthesize all B1-B2 structural skills, demonstrating confidence and readiness for advanced or bilingual career paths.

Understanding Language Levels (CEFR)

The CEFR framework is an international standard used worldwide to describe how well a person speaks a foreign language, ranging from A1 (Beginner) to C2 (Native Level).

Level	Title	What a student can do:
A1	Beginner	Understand and use simple everyday words and basic phrases to express simple needs.
A2	Elementary	Understand simple sentences about daily life, family, shopping, work, and local geography.
B1	Intermediate	Deal with travel situations and talk about familiar topics like work, school, hobbies, and personal dreams.
B2	Upper Intermediate	Understand the main points of complex reading texts and speak fluidly with native speakers without stress.
C1	Advanced	Understand long, difficult texts. Speak fluently, naturally, and spontaneously for social, professional, or school purposes.
C2	Proficient	Understand almost everything heard or read with ease. Speak perfectly and express subtle shades of meaning clearly.
