What is the Intermediate Track?

This guide shows what students learn in the intermediate stages of our program. The Intermediate Track helps students move from simple phrases to confident, independent speaking. Students will learn to comfortably handle conversations for work, school, travel, and daily life.

This program matches the international **CEFR B1 and B2** standards.

Simple Monthly Billing: Even though the program is split into 3-month steps to help students learn smoothly, classes are billed month by month. There are no contracts.

WHAT STUDENTS WILL LEARN

Level 1: Intermediate English Part 1 (CEFR B1)

3 Months • Billed Monthly

GOAL: EXPRESS OPINIONS & SHARE PERSONAL EXPERIENCES

- **Everyday Conversations:** Talk easily about hobbies, interests, routines, and free time using a wider variety of natural words.
- **Telling Stories:** Learn how to describe past experiences, travel stories, and important life events in a clear, step-by-step order.
- **Sharing Preferences:** Practice comparing different options, giving helpful advice, and explaining simple reasons for choices.

GOAL: HANDLE TRAVEL AND DAILY CHALLENGES

- **Travel & Problem Solving:** Get the language tools needed to handle unexpected problems while traveling, booking hotels, or shopping.
- **Work & School:** Talk about your job duties, professional background, studies, and future career goals with confidence.
- **Active Discussions:** Practice sharing clear opinions on current news, movies, music, and simple abstract topics.

Level 2: Intermediate English Part 3 (CEFR B1)

GOAL: GAIN INDEPENDENCE AND UNDERSTAND MEDIA

- **Longer Conversations:** Learn how to connect detailed ideas to make conversations flow smoothly and naturally.
- **Hopes & Future Choices:** Practice explaining personal goals, making formal requests, and talking about hypothetical "what-if" situations.
- **Understanding Media:** Build skills to find the main ideas in clear English audio clips, podcasts, videos, and short articles.

Level 4: Upper-Intermediate English Part 1 (CEFR B2)

3 Months • Billed Monthly

GOAL: SPEAK FLUENTLY ABOUT COMPLEX TOPICS

- **Detailed Explanations:** Learn to give clear arguments, weigh pros and cons, and defend your opinions on complicated issues.
- **Business Skills:** Practice giving short professional presentations and handling work calls confidently.
- **Natural Vocabulary:** Use common idioms, phrasal verbs, and descriptive words to make your English sound more natural and authentic.

Level 5: Upper-Intermediate English Part 2 (CEFR B2)

3 Months • Billed Monthly

GOAL: CHAT SPONTANEOUSLY WITH NATIVE SPEAKERS

- **Spontaneous Speaking:** Build the speed and ease needed to talk with native speakers smoothly without needing to prepare ahead of time.
- **Modern Trends:** Understand and join conversations about technology, culture, and current global changes.
- **Grammar Check:** Polish your use of passive voice, modal verbs, and complex tenses to express exact meanings clearly.

Level 6: Upper-Intermediate English Part 3 (CEFR B2)

3 Months • Billed Monthly

GOAL: MASTER TOTAL FLUENCY & CAREER READINESS

- **Perfecting the Flow:** Learn to express subtle shades of meaning, emphasize key points, and keep up with fast debates.
- **Media Analysis:** Build skills to review and discuss movies, news reports, analytical articles, and book summaries.
- **Career Preparation:** Practice advanced mock job interviews, learn formal report writing, and clean up your pronunciation.

UNDERSTANDING LANGUAGE LEVELS (CEFR)

The CEFR framework is an international standard used worldwide to describe how well a person speaks a foreign language, ranging from A1 (Beginner) to C2 (Native Level).

Level	Title	What a student can do:
A1	Beginner	Understand and use simple everyday words and basic phrases to express simple needs.
A2	Elementary	Understand simple sentences about daily life, family, shopping, work, and local geography.
B1	Intermediate	Deal with travel situations and talk about familiar topics like work, school, hobbies, and personal dreams.
B2	Upper Intermediate	Understand the main points of complex reading texts and speak fluidly with native speakers without stress.
C1	Advanced	Understand long, difficult texts. Speak fluently, naturally, and spontaneously for social, professional, or school purposes.
C2	Proficient	Understand almost everything heard or read with ease. Speak perfectly and express subtle shades of meaning clearly.
